Founded in 1981 EFPA has a long tradition of **developing psychology** (by enhancing scientific and professional standards), **contributing to society** (by using psychological knowledge and competences in support in particular of the UN sustainable development goals) and **servicing psychologists** (by advancing, promoting and protecting the profession of psychologists at the national and European levels).

EFPA has a network of some 350,000 psychologists through its Full Members (professional practitioner psychologists and researchers) and many stakeholders including Associate Members which exists to promote a particular domain of psychology as education, science, and/or profession or support a particular group of Psychologists or students or teachers of psychology.

EFPA is a partner in many EU Commission funded research and development projects. EFPA sets a European standard of education, professional training and competence in psychology.
